My Top Tips for Settling In:

1. Communication is Key

Voice your concerns and don't be afraid to ask questions – we are there and happy to answer any questions and queries you might have.

2. Be Reasonable with Your Expectations

It's never going to be perfect, but with good communication, the help of an experienced nursery team, you can create a smooth transition together.

3. <u>Be Strong and Be</u> Prepared for Tears

Children often get upset, especially to start with, but that isn't necessarily a sign that something is wrong — it's more likely their way of communicating that they don't want you to leave, but the do soon begin to bond with the staff and will be running into the building in no time!

4. Have Trust

Nursery staff have been through this transition many times. They know what they're doing, and they want you and your child to succeed - listen to our advice and work with us to find what works for your little one.

5. Go With Your Gut & Keep Smiling!

Your child will pick up on your emotions, so if you appear happy and calm this will help to reassure them. Difficult as it may be, remember that you've chosen the nursery knowing that it will help to broaden your little one's exposure to new experiences and skills, which in turn, will have a positive impact on their overall wellbeing and development.

6. <u>Talk About Your</u> Child's Interests

Give us as much information as you can about your child, including their likes and dislikes so they can have their favourite toys out to help make them feel happy and comfortable. If they have a comforter or a special toy, bring it with them.
